Pope Francis to Visit Ireland –Knock & Dublin this summer



On Saturday, August 25, the Pope will arrive into Dublin Airport on a direct flight from Rome. It is expected there will be a motorcade through the streets, as happened with JFK's visit back in the 60s. Events for the day will include a visit to Áras an Uachtaráin to meet President Michael D Higgins and his wife Sabina. He will then attend a civic reception hosted by the Taoiseach, expected to be held in Dublin Castle. The Pope will also visit the Pro Cathedral, where he will be shown around by Catholic Archbishop of Dublin Diarmuid Martin. In the early evening, he will go to the Capuchin Day Centre and see their work in providing meals and shelter to homeless people. In the evening the Pope will attend the World Meeting of Families celebrations in Croke Park, where he will be greeted by up to 80,000 people. A visit to the Papal Nuncio is also likely at some stage of the weekend and could be included in the Saturday night schedule, according to draft planning.

On Sunday morning, August 26, the Pope will fly to **Knock** early to attend the Marian shrine. He is expected to return to Dublin around midday. Later that afternoon he will say Pontifical Mass in the Phoenix Park for a crowd that's estimated to number at least 600,000 people.

From 1892 to 1954, the federal immigration service and its employees processed over twelve million immigrants at the Ellis Island Immigration Station in New York Harbor. The video, created by USCIS, tells the story of Ellis Island from the perspective of those who worked there, highlighting the historical connections between our agency's mission to administer lawful immigration to the U.S. and this iconic port of entry in New York." USCIS holds a distinctive place in history for its role in processing immigrants into the fabric of our nation," USCIS Director L. Francis Cissna said to employees at the premiere.
